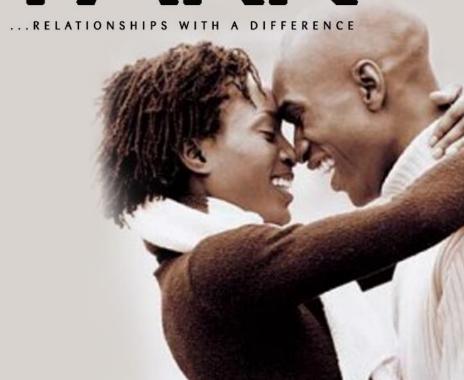

THE EMOTIONAL BANK ACCOUNT

{LESSONS FROM STEPHEN COVEY'S 7 HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE PEOPLE }

We know what a financial bank account is. We make deposits into it and build up a reserve from which we can make withdrawals when we need to.

An emotional bank account is a metaphor that describes the amount of trust that has been built up in a relationship. In the financial bank account, I build my reserve by depositing money. But for an emotional bank account, we make deposits through kindness, courtesy, honesty, keeping our commitments to one another. The more I make these deposits, the more I gain your trust.

When I've gained enough trust, I can make withdrawals at will. I can easily gain your trust over anything. No matter what I do to you, you won't make me an offender when the trust level is high.

But if I have a habit of showing discourtesy, disrespect, cutting you off, overreacting, ignoring you, becoming arbitrary, betraying your trust, threatening you, eventually, my Emotional bank account would be overdrawn.

The moment my emotional bank account is overdrawn, the trust level gets very low. I'd also begin to live with tension. I'd have to be very careful with everything I say, and measure every word. This flaw has become the undoing of many organizations, families and marriages.

If a large reserve of trust is not sustained by continuing deposits, a marriage will deteriorate. Our most constant relationships, like marriage, require our most constant deposits. In a financial bank account, your old deposits may remain; but in an emotional bank account, old deposits evaporate if expectations are not met.

DEPOSITS THAT BUILD THE EMOTIONAL BANK ACCOUNT:

1. Understand the Individual

Seeking to understand another person is probably one of the most important deposits you can make. As a matter of thoughts, it is the key to every other deposit that I'd be sharing in these series. And this is because,

what might be a deposit for you may not be perceived by someone else as a deposit at all. It might even be perceived as a withdrawal, if it doesn't touch the person's deep interests or needs.

One person's interest is another person's minutia. To make a deposit, what is important to another person must be as important to you as the other person is to you. For instance, you may be working on a high priority project when your child interrupts with something that seems trivial to you, but it may be very important from his own point of view. By accepting the value he places on what he has to say, you show an understanding of him that makes a great deposit.

There's this story about a college professor, who had a terrible relationship with his teenage son. This man's entire life was essentially academic, and he felt his son was totally wasting life by working with his hands instead of working to develop his mind. He was constantly on the boys back, and the boy lived with the feeling of rejection. Their relationship was turning sour, and it was breaking the father's heart. When understood this Deposit, he engaged his son to build a miniature Wall of China around their home. It was a consuming project, and they worked side by side for over a year. That singular act of the father increased the desire of the son to develop his mind, which became a major benefit to both the son and the father.

2. Attend to little things

Kindness and courtesies may sometimes appear little; but they're always so important. Small discourtesies, little unkindness, little forms of disrespect usually make large withdrawals. In a relationship, the little things are the big things.

Stephen Covey shared an experience on how he spent an evening with his two sons. He took his sons to watch gymnastics, wrestling matches, and movies. He also fed them with their favourite snacks and drinks. The younger son slept off while in the movies and didn't wake up - even after the movie had ended. Their father had to carry him to the car, and laid him on the back seat. He also took off his coat and covered him with it - just to protect him from the extremely cold weather.

When they got home, the eldest son quickly undressed and went to his bed with a sad countenance. Stephen went to his room - hoping to have a good conversation with him. And when he tried to talk, he noticed that the boy's eyes were welling up with tears. He asked the boy what had happened; and surprisingly, the boy responded saying "Daddy, if I were cold, would you put your coat around me too?".

People are very tender and sensitive inside. And your age or experience can't override this truth. Even if your heart is as tough as a rock, you'd still have a soft spot.

3. Keep Commitments

Keeping a commitment or a promise is a major deposit; breaking one is a major withdrawal. There's probably not a more massive withdrawal than to make a promise that's important to someone and not fulfill it. The next time a promise is made, they won't believe it.

People tend to build their hopes around promises, particularly promises about their basic livelihood. I've tried to adopt a philosophy as a person - never to make a promise I don't keep. And if I must make a promise on something I've never done, then I'd try to make it carefully. I'd be aware of all the variables and contingencies attached to the promise - so that something doesn't

suddenly come up to keep me from fulfilling it.

Occasionally, despite all my effort, the unexpected does come up, creating a situation where it would be unwise or impossible to keep a promise I've made. To be candid, I value every promise I make. But when I can't keep them, I quickly explain the situation thoroughly to the person involved and ask to be released from the promise.

I believe that if you cultivate the habit of always keeping the promises you make, you'd build bridges of trust that span the gaps of understanding between your relationships.

4. Clarify Expectations

The cause of almost all relationship difficulties is rooted in conflicting or ambiguous expectations around roles and goals. Unclear expectations will always lead to misunderstanding, disappointment, and withdrawal of trust.

Many expectations are implicit. They haven't been explicitly stated or announced, but people nevertheless bring them to a particular situation. In marriage, for example, a man and a woman have implicit expectations of each other in their marriage roles. Although these expectations have not been discussed, or sometimes even recognized by the person who has them, fulfilling them makes great deposits in the

relationship and violating them makes withdrawals.

That's why it's important to get all expectations out on the table whenever you get into a new situation or relationship. People will begin to judge each other based on those expectations. And if they feel like their basic expectations have been violated, the reserve of trust is diminished. We create many negative situations by simply assuming that our expectations are self-evident and that they are clearly understood and shared by other people.

This deposit is to help us make our expectations clear and explicit in the beginning. When expectations are not clear and shared, people begin to become emotionally involved and simple

misunderstandings become compounded, turning into personality clashes and communication breakdowns.

5. Show Personal Integrity

Personal integrity generates trust and is the basis of many different kinds of deposits. Integrity includes but goes beyond honesty. Honesty is telling the truth, integrity is keeping promises and fulfilling expectations.

One of the most important ways to manifest integrity is to be loyal yo those who are not present. In doing so, we build the trust of those who are present. When you defend those who are absent, you retain the trust of those present.

Suppose you and I were talking alone, and we were criticizing our supervisor in a way that we would not dare to do if he were present. Now what will happen when you and I have a misunderstanding? You should know I'm going to be discussing your weaknesses with someone else. That's what you and I did behind our supervisor's back. You already know my nature; I'd sweet-talk you to your face and bad-mouth you behind your back.

On the other hand, suppose you were to start criticizing our supervisor and I basically told you I agree with the content of some of the criticism and suggest that the two of us go directly to him and make an effective presentation on how things might be improved. Then what would you know I would do if someone were to criticize you to me behind your back? Treat everyone with

the same set of principles; and as you do, people will come to trust you.

6. Apologize Sincerely When You Make a Withdrawal

When we make withdrawals from the Emotional Bank Account, we need to apologize and we need to do it sincerely. Great deposits come in the sincere words like;

"I was wrong, That was unkind of me, I showed you no respect, I gave you no dignity - I'm deeply sorry, I embarrassed you in front of your friends and I had no call to do that - even though I wanted to make a point - I never should have done that - I apologize".

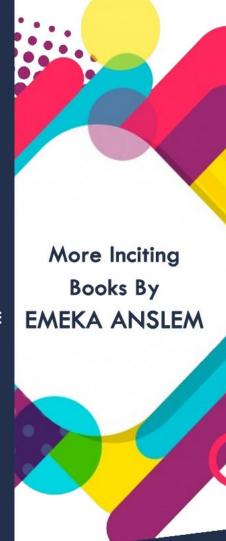
It takes a great deal of character strength to apologize quickly out of one's heart rather than out of pity. People with little internal security can't do it. It makes them too vulnerable. They feel it makes them appear soft and weak, and they fear that others will take advantage of their weakness. Their security is based on the opinions of other people, and they worry about what others might think. In addition, they usually feel justified in what they did. They rationalize their own wrong in the name of the other person's wrong, and if they apologize at all, it's superficial.
